



In the morning, I talked about research with Alan of CSSL. In the afternoon, EVL doctoral student Bob (Robert Kooima) introduced us to the Varrier family of autostereoscopic display systems. Bob was a presenter at the recent Adler SVL seminar at the Adler Planetarium & Astronomical Museum. The 35 Panel Cylindrical Varier has a structure in which 35 (=7 vertical \times 5 horizontal) displays are arranged in a cylindrical shape, and is a device that displays 3D images without glasses. The feature is that the

sensor worn on the user's head automatically adjusts so that the optimal stereoscopic vision is always obtained even if the user moves. It should also be noted that the input is a three-dimensional controller using a gyroscope. The demo video is Mars and was provided by NASA. I really felt like I was a Mars Global Surveyor flying over Mars. Personal Varrier has a simple structure with only one ordinary display, and is similarly a device that displays 3D images without glasses. The feature is that the camera attached to the top of the display recognizes the position of the user's face and automatically adjusts so that the optimal stereoscopic view is always obtained even if the user moves. It learns the user's face with a neural network. The demonstration video is in space, and you can learn the positional relationship of the stars that make up the constellation. Personally, Personal Varier looked more three-dimensional. It is a device with a wide range of applications such as virtual shopping and entertainment, as well as medicine and engineering. Then Jason LeighI met with an assistant professor. The teacher is also in charge of a game development class (!) called Video Game Design and Programming. After that, Dr. Wang introduced me to LambdaVision . The photo is Personal Varrier (you can't tell from the photo, but the stars actually pop out of the screen).
